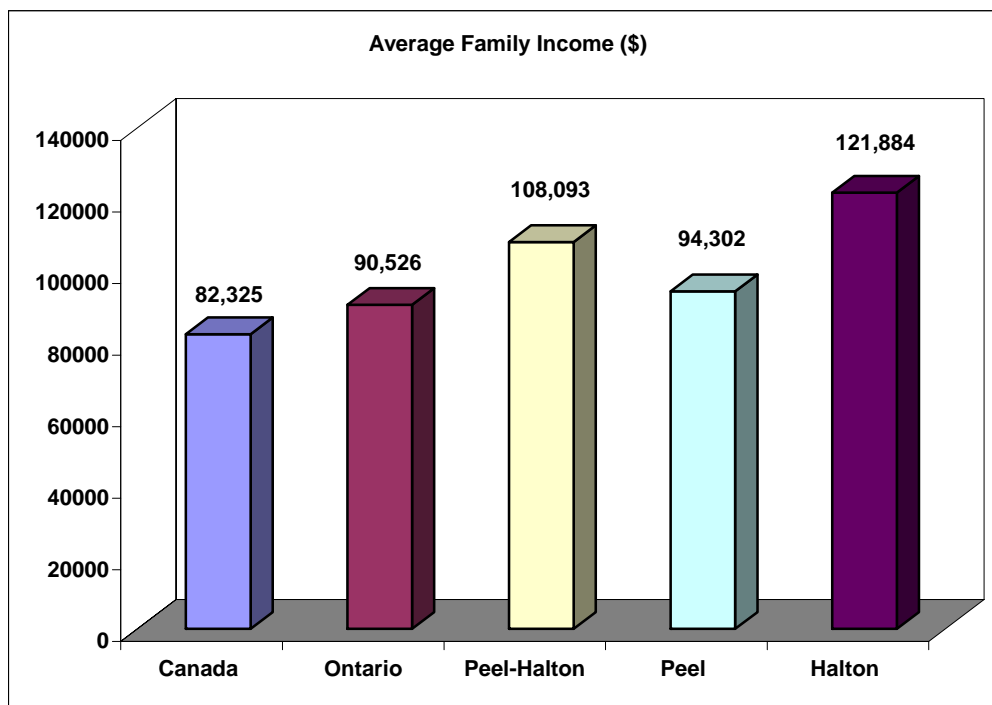
Highlights for the Peel-Halton Area

This newsletter provides the average family income and the average employment income by occupation in the Peel-Halton (PH) area by using official data from the 2006 Census of Canada (Statistics Canada). - ◆ In 2005, the average family income in PH was higher than that in Ontario and Canada.
- ◆ Over all occupations, female earned income averaged 69.8% of male earned income.
- ◆ The gender gap in income was largest in “professional occupations in health”.

Did you know?

What is the average family income in PH?

In 2005, the average family income in PH was higher than in Ontario, and Canada [PH (\$108,093), Ontario (\$90,526) and Canada (\$82,325)]. Within the PH area, Halton has the highest average family income (\$121,884), followed by Peel at \$94,302.

What is the average (full time, full year) employment income of individual residents of PH?

In 2005, the average (full time, full year) employment income of individual residents of PH was \$58,824 compared to \$55,626 in Ontario.

How do incomes of men and women in PH compare?

In 2005, men earned an average of \$67,583 in full-time employment income, compared to an average of \$47,162 for women.
